West Barnstable Civic Association Meeting Minutes

Tuesday, May 3, 2022

West Barnstable Community Building, Meetinghouse Way

I. Call to Order

President Andrew Lee called the regular meeting of the West Barnstable Civic Association to order at 7:03 PM.

II. Attendance

Board members in attendance were Andy Lee, Ed Jay, Jon Britton, Maria DeMayo, Nancy Meagher, Bob Stolte, Dan Dewey, and Dan Philos-Jensen. Also in attendance were Precinct 11 Councilor Kris Clark and Scholarship Chair Sue Leary.

III. Approval of Minutes

Meeting minutes from April 5, 2022 were amended and approved by a unanimous vote. The motion to approve was made by Maris DeMayo and seconded by Ed Jay.

IV. Councilor's Report

Construction within Route 149 overpass is anticipated to take around 22-months. The construction will be staged with lane shifts, and two-way traffic will be maintained throughout construction. No major updates to report. The contractor has begun concrete pours on the east side of the bridge and work is progressing as planned. A generator for the West Barnstable Community Building WAS PASSED by the Town Council in the Capital Improvement Plan budget hearing on April 28th. Fire Chief Joe Maruca explained at the Public Hearing of its importance to the West Barnstable community since our residents are on wells and septic systems. The WBCA should begin discussions with the Fire Chief and Police Chief to develop a protocol for staffing a "Warming Station" once the generator is installed. Nancy Meagher and I have attended training for staffing a shelter and have come to understand some of the considerations for developing a plan for action if and when there are extended power outages in West Barnstable.

Also, Representative Xiarhos, filed Amendment 765 requesting \$75,000 to fund this same generator. The Commonwealth is in budget discussions now. The hope is this expenditure can help defray this expense to the Town.

I was re-elected as Water Commissioner, winning more votes than Ryan Coholan who ran a robust write-in campaign. According to the WB Fire/Water District Clerk, Elaine Grace, there were 35 votes for Kris Clark; 26 votes for Ryan Coholan and 4 blanks.

Ed Jay was elected to the Prudential Committee member as a write-in candidate with 38 votes, 1 for Ryan Coholan, 2 for James Stergis and 1 for Rosalie Bell. 23 were left blank. We thank Van Northcross for his 14 years of service as Prudential Committee member for our Fire District. Van chose not to run for re-election.

I/we also thank Elaine Grace for her years of service as District Clerk. She is retiring this year after 26 years of service. Dan Furbish will be the new Fire District Clerk as of July 1, 2022.

The Annual Meeting for the West Barnstable Fire and Water District was held on Wednesday, April 27, 2022, at 7pm at the West Barnstable Community Building, passing the proposed budget

The Water Commissioners hosted a Public Information Meeting where the public saw the same PowerPoint presentation that we (elected officials) were given by the Town's DPW staff on their plans to drill for water to

service the Hyannis Water Supply Division. The Town Manager agreed to arrange to have this meeting videotaped so that those who are not able to attend this meeting may view it on Channel 18, the Town's public access television channel. 
The WB Water Commissioners will host meetings on the first Monday of upcoming months at the West Barnstable Community Building. The first meeting will be on June 2 at 7pm.
